### APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

**W**e are pleased that you are considering Clackamas Community College and are happy to provide you with our 2010-2011 International Student admission materials. #### Frequently Asked Questions:

##### *How do I apply?*

Please complete the application materials and checklist on the inside of this packet. All items listed must be provided before your application can be processed.

##### *When do I apply?*

We encourage you to apply at least one term prior to the term you plan to begin your studies. Filing deadlines for the 2010-2011 academic year are as follows:

<b>Summer Term 2010</b>	Due by: May 28, 2010
<b>Fall Term 2010</b>	Due by: August 27, 2010
<b>Winter Term 2011</b>	Due by: December 3, 2010
<b>Spring Term 2011</b>	Due by: February 25, 2010

##### *What if I am a transfer student from another school or university in the United States?*

You will be required to provide us with a copy of your current I-20 and a completed International Student Transfer Questionnaire.

##### *Can I be enrolled part-time?*

All international students are required to maintain a full course of study (12 credits). Students admitted to the Program for International English must maintain a minimum of 18 class hours per week.

##### *Does CCC provide housing?*

We do not provide on campus housing. However, a list of local housing options is available by going to [www.clackamas.edu](http://www.clackamas.edu) and clicking on Future Students and then on "International Student."

##### *Do I need a TOEFL score?*

A TOEFL score is not required. International Students pursuing a college level course of study will be given an English placement test upon arrival. Students needing a higher level of English proficiency to succeed in college credit courses will be placed in the Program for Intensive English.

#### Admission Policy Statement

*Clackamas Community College is approved by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to admit qualified students from other countries.*

*International students may be admitted to the college if they can demonstrate proficiency in English and have the financial ability to pursue a full course of study in the United States.*

*International students are required to maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA and complete at least 12 credits each term. Program for Intensive English Students are also required to maintain a 2.0 GPA and complete a minimum of 18 weekly class hours each term.*

## APPLICATION CHECKLIST

### Required Items

The following documents are required for admission. All items listed below must be received by the Registrar's Office prior to reviewing your application and the issuing of an I-20.

- CCC Application for Admission
- \$50.00 processing fee (Please include an additional \$65.00 to have your I-20 sent to you by express mail.)
- Program of study:
  - Program for Intensive English. One year program. (Upon completion of the Program for Intensive English, students may begin a college level course of study.) Students must be non-native speakers of English and must have a minimum age of 16.
  - College level course of study. Two year associate's degree program. Please indicate your program title and program code. (See the Clackamas Community College Schedule of Classes for codes.)
- International Student Financial Statement and all supporting documentation as stated on this form
- Official transcripts from all prior post-secondary colleges or universities attended
- International Student Questionnaire form
- Verification of Health Insurance form
- International Student Transfer Questionnaire (only if you are transferring from a school within the U.S.)

CCC does not conditionally admit students. We will not issue an I-20 until all documents have been received and an admission decision has been made. Make sure all of your documents are submitted well before the application deadline to ensure you have enough time to apply for your student visa.

If you are married and plan to bring your spouse, you will need an additional \$7,500.00 per year to meet his or her expenses. The minimum expenditure for each child is \$3,500.00 per year. 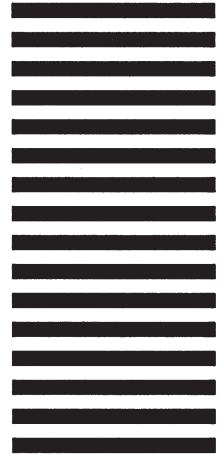
