*Clackamas Community College (CCC) provides college credit programs specifically designed for high school students.*



*College credit that students register for in high school appears on students' CCC transcript.*

### **High School Connections Programs**

CCC offers five college credit programs for high school students.

#### **Advanced College Credit (ACC)**

ACC classes are college courses taken at the high school and taught by an approved high school instructor. High school instructors must meet qualifying college criteria. ACC classes are \$10 per credit, charged directly to the student.\*

#### **College and Career Readiness (CCR)**

CCR provides opportunities for students to gain college and career readiness skills while earning college credit. High school or agency instructors must meet college qualifying criteria. CCR classes are \$10 per credit, charged directly to the student.\*



#### **Expanded Options / Early College Program**

Expanded Options/Early College allows students to take classes at the college campus or online. Classes are paid for by the school district/high school.

#### **High School Career and Technical Education (CTE)**

High School CTE courses are held on the college campus and taught by college faculty. Students participate in hands-on courses in auto body, automotive, manufacturing and welding with other high school students. Classes are paid for by the school district/high school.

#### **High School Plus**

High School Plus classes are college classes taught by college faculty at partner high schools or designated locations. Classes are paid for by the school district/high school.

*\*Students receiving free/reduced lunch can have ACC and CCR fees waived. High school counselors add students to the fee waiver list that is submitted to CCC.*



#### **Program Requirements:**

- Students may only participate in the programs offered at their high school.
- Contracts with high schools and/or school districts are required.
- Expanded Options / Early College and High School CTE students must be referred to participate by their school district/high school.
